Food that was on top of a כירה on שבת in a permissible way, (coals either covered or shovelled) may be returned once removed as long as the following conditions are met: According to the מחבר the conditions are that the food is still very hot, and the pot was not placed on the ground. The רמ"א holds that it is permissible to put the pot back on the fire as long as the contents of the pot have not cooled down, but the person must keep his hand on the pot, and have in mind to put the pot back before he removes it.

2 ovens next to each other, sharing a common wall, if the coals of one oven have been shovelled and covered with ash, even if the other oven's have not, it is still permissible to use the oven that has been shovelled and covered, even though the oven that has not adds heat.

One may place food in a pot next to an oven, even if the coals of the oven have not been covered with ash or shovelled, and even if the area is very hot. תוספת writes that we should not imply from here that we may put food next to an open fire, since the fire was not open, because there is the wall of the oven separating the food from the fire.

The רמב"ם holds that if the coals have died out, it is as if they are covered.

An oven whose coals have not been covered or shovelled, food that is fully cooked may be left on the fire, as long as continued exposure to the fire is not beneficial to the food.
